She will mention 116 year history in the community, Church affiliated, regional impact of Advocate Medical Group, Advocate Eureka Hospital as a critical access hospital, Graduate Medical Ed programs, affiliation with Mennonite College of Nursing, new Advocate BroMenn Outpatient Center, and more.

Sonja Reece will compare and contrast the experience of three consolidations, or mergers: Mennonite Hospital and Eureka Hospital in 1978, Mennonite/Eureka and Brokaw hospitals in 1984, then BroMenn and Advocate in 2010.
